

Critical Care Emergency Medical Transport Provider

The Critical Care Transport Program was designed by the University of Maryland, Baltimore County to prepare paramedics and nurses to function as members of a critical care transport team. Critical patients that must be transported between facilities require a different level of care from hospital or emergency field patients.

The Critical Care Transport Program brings paramedics and nurses together in an effort to bridge the gap between prehospital and hospital care. The result is a specialized care provider that has an understanding of both aspects of patient care, and uses the understanding to provide the highest level of care to critical patients during transport.

Course Information

Critical Care Transport

Purpose

This intensive course offers the foundation which will prepare the paramedic or nurse to become a critical care transport specialist. The 80+ hour course covers a wide variety of critical care topics, including:

- The Critical Care Environment
- Breathing Management
- Surgical Airway Management
- Hemodynamic Management
- Cardiac Management
- Pharmacological Management
- GI, GU, and Renal Management
- Neurological Management
- Transport Considerations
- Special Considerations

We will attempt to schedule clinical rotations for those students interested.

Students with 100% attendance will be evaluated with a written examination at the end of the course. Upon successful completion, the student will receive a renewable certificate from UMBC valid for 3 years. This course meets National Registry recertification requirements.

Tuition

Tuition for this course is \$825 per person. Please make the check payable to "MCV Foundation".

Credit cards are also accepted. Enrollment is limited to 30 persons. We reserve the right to cancel or reschedule the course depending on enrollment.

Attendees

The CCEMTPSM course is open to any paramedic or nurse that has worked in that capacity for at least one year. Current CPR, ACLS, PALS or PEPP or ENPC or PPC, and BTLS or PHTLS or TNCC is required. Copies of your certification cards, including RN license and/or paramedic, **must** be submitted with your registration and check. Failure to do so will prohibit registration in the CCEMTPSM class.

Continuing-Education

CEUs are approved by the Virginia Office of EMS. This continuing education activity is approved by UMBC, an organization accredited by the Continuing Education Coordination Board for EMS (CECBEMS).

Faculty

Instructors may be physicians, nurses or paramedics with extensive experience in critical care and critical care transport. All instructors are approved by the VCU/MCV Center for Trauma and Critical Care Education and UMBC.
